TOOMB'S LAKE.

AT a meeting of the owners and occupiers of land on the banks of the Macquarie River, held at Campbellton, 10th March, 1841, for the purpose of considering the best means of securing the benefits at present felt from a constant supply of water in the Macquarie River.

It was proposed by Mr. Kermod, and seconded by Mr. Horne.

That an address be presented to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor to acknowledge the great benefits which have already been derived from the reservation of Toomb's Lake, and to submit to His Excellency the great importance of reserving the 'Long Marsh,' on the northern branch of the Macquarie, as an additional basin to further the object of irrigation.

Further to urge upon His Excellency's attention the important consideration of reserving both 'Toomb's Lake' and the 'Long Marsh' in perpetuity for the benefit of the public."

"That the embankment already formed at 'Toomb's Lake' be raised and strengthened, and a cut made at one end of the embankment with a substantial sluice gate, to ensure the safety of the works and to regulate the supply of water."

"That Mr. R. Q. Kermod, Mr. George Scott, and Mr. Arthur Smith, be nominated a committee for the present year, with a request to prepare and present the address, and to superintend the proposed improvements."

Proposed by Mr. Allison, and seconded by Mr. Philip Smith,

"That Mr. Geo. Scott be appointed Secretary and Treasurer for the ensuing year,
