



Comprehensive collecting of Australian sheet music publishing



Selective collecting of overseas music performed and/or distributed in Australia, including music scores.

- 7.183 collection level records.
- \$187,579 from the acquisitions budget.
- Purchase from Australian Music Centre.
- More than 60% decrease in collecting particularly after Collection Development Policy changes over 5 years
- 51% increase in edeposit over 5 years





Collection Diversity



48 items with First Nations content collected. First Nations Collecting is trending upwards, though still in low numbers.

Female composers are represented in significant numbers among new acquisitions, though far from gender parity. Trending upwards.
