Letters of John Fitzsimmons (d. 1860) and his daughter Kate Tooth

John Fitzsimons (Vale of Clwyd, NSW) to his brother Lawrence Fitzsimmon (Dublin), 13 Jan. 1841: deaths of their parents; requests a likeness; enlisted in 3rd Rifle Brigade in 1818; financial matters.

John Fitzsimmons (Hartley, NSW) to Lawrence Fitzsimmons, 19 Nov. 1843: thanks for memento of their father; property matters; family news.

John Fitzsimmons (Hartley) to Lawrence Fitzsimmons, 7 April 1845: illness; expects to receive a government medical appointment; property; his daughter.

John Fitzsimmons (Darlinghurst, Sydney) to Lawrence Fitzsimmons, 22 July 1847. (illegible)

John Fitzsimmons to Lawrence Fitzsimmons, n.d.: sends lock of his daughter's hair.

Kate Tooth (Sydney) to her cousin, 16 June 1871: pleased that she has one relative in the world; death of her father in 1860; her daughter.

Note: All the letters of Fitzsimmons have crossed writing and are of very poor legibility. The letters were filmed on the same reel as the diary of John Ricou. With both collections, the images appear from right to left on the reel.
